** Dates and details will be announced when determined in update changes to the summer training schedule, or by separate correspondence to units. This exchange is in planning and is expected to be much like last years, originating in D.C. with all expenses paid by the Navy Memorial foundation.

2. Application procedures are as per the enclosures. Where applications are greater than the number of allowed quotas, selections will be made by NHQ in concert with COTC recommendations and desires. Cadets desiring to apply for more than one program must state their first and second choices. Generally, only one program per cadet will be entertained. **Cadets should not purchase airline tickets until notified of selection by NHQ.**

3. For all cadets selected or approved for Foreign Exchange program participation, additional guidance and/or information will be provided either by NHQ or the COTC/ Senior Escort Officer for the evolution.

4. No Sea Cadet exchange will take place unless escort requirements are met. Amplifying information will as provided by COTC/Senior Escort Officers, or as published in updates to the summer training schedule (including further identification of COTC/Senior Escort Officers as appropriate).

BERMUDA FOREIGN EXCHANGE

1. **Dates:** Arrive Wednesday, 31 March, depart Wednesday, 14 April
2. **General:** The USNSCC is authorized to send five (5) cadets (male or female) and one escort. Other countries participating include Bermuda, Canada, and the UK. Except for official functions and visits, most of the time will be spent in civilian clothes. Official visits will require Service Dress Whites (Jumpers - two sets) for males, and Summer Whites (2 sets) for females. Two sets of dungarees/utilities are required. Bermuda dresses somewhat more formally at night, so plan to bring the proper accessories. Temperature will be a blustery 72 degrees.
3. **Training/Activities:** Activities during the exchange will include historic tours, seasonal boating activities, cadet activities with local Sea Cadet units, and courtesy calls on a number of local dignitaries, including the governor.
4. **Qualifications:** Sea Cadets applying for this exchange must meet the following requirements:
 - Must be 16 or older on or before the start of training
 - Must be E-3 or above
 - Must not have participated in this exchange before
 - Recipient of the Cadet Citation Ribbon
 - Recommended by unit Commanding Officer
5. **Logistics/Costs:** NSCC personnel will travel to and from Bermuda at their own expense; government transportation is not available. **Cadets must have in their possession either a passport or official birth certificate with raised seal** in order to enter Bermuda (Cadets without either of these will be returned home). The main source of transportation is by moped, and participants will need \$184.00 to pay for rental cost for the two-week period. A \$20.00 "exit tax" is also required. The Bermuda Sea Cadet Association will provide berthing, and almost all messing, at no cost. Bermuda is expensive, and it is recommended that cadets take \$250.00 to pay for gifts and other purchases. Keep COTC/SEO advised of your travel itinerary.
6. **Application Procedures:** **SUBMIT TRAINING REQUESTS (NSC-22) DIRECTLY TO NHQ AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE.**

VERY IMPORTANT: Applications were requested to NHQ by 24 February 1999. Selections to be made immediately following. We still have quotas. We will continue to accept applications until we have no more quotas.

This early date was requested to allow for early notification so that selectees have plenty of time to make flight arrangements. **Late applications will be entertained dependant upon quota availability.** Notification of selection will be made by NHQ, and those selected will be given additional information on other uniform/clothing items, an updated program of events, and other items of interest provided by Bermuda.

UNITED KINGDOM EXCHANGE

(LCDR Dave Farrow COTC/SEO)

1. **Dates.** Depart U.S. Saturday 12 June, return U.S. Sunday 27 June.
2. **General.** Leave US - 12 June (Saturday), arrive London (Heathrow) - 13 June - Coach will transport group to HMS BRISTOL in Portsmouth to stay 6 nights from 13 June to 19 June. Coach will transport group to HMS RALEIGH in Plymouth to stay 4 nights from 19 June to 23 June. Coach will transport group to TS Windsor Castle in London to stay 4 nights from 23 June to 27 June. Coach will transport group to Heathrow airport for departure 27 June (Sunday) arrive US - 27 June.

Quotas are as follows:

20 male cadets
5 female cadets
3 male officers, 2 female officers
1 male Chief

3. **Training/Activities.** Training at HMS BRISTOL to include: Level 1 & 2 boating, both sail & power, small arms training, leadership skills training, etc. Cultural visits to include: D-Day Map Room at Dryad, Fort Nelson, HMS VICTORY warship & Naval Museum, Royal Marine Museum.

Training at HMS RALEIGH to include: Fire & damage control, assault course, leadership, sporting events. Cultural visits to include: historic town of Plymouth, HMS DRAKE Naval Museum, shipyard & ropery.

Other cultural visits to include Stonehenge & Arundel Castle.

Activities at TS Windsor Castle to include: Windsor Castle tour, Eaton College, boating, London Day trip to include - Tower of London, Westminster Abbey, Buckingham Palace & Trafalgar Square. Windsor Unit will also be celebrating its centennial.

4. **Qualifications.**

- Be in good physical condition

5. **Logistics/Costs.** Costs will be \$325 per cadet (not including air fare). Air fare and transportation to and from Heathrow is the responsibility of the cadet. COTC/SEO will advise of specifics with regard to times to arrive/depart, and where to meet busses at Heathrow. COTC/SEO will meet each cadet at arrival gate. This cost includes all of the above entrance fees, ground transportation, berthing & messing charges where applicable. It is advised that cadets bring \$150 spending money. \$100.00 deposit is required with the NSC-22, and remaining \$175.00 due to COTC/SEO right after orders are cut.

6. **Application Procedures.** CALL COTC/SEO FIRST AND ADVISE OF YOUR DESIRE TO JOIN AND GET HIS PERMISSION, THEN SEND NSC-22 TO COTC/SEO FOR FINAL SCREEN WITH \$100.00 DEPOSIT. COTC/SEO will forward 22's to NHQ for cutting orders. Orders will be sent to cadets unit CO, copy to COTC/SEO. Right after you get your orders, send remaining \$175.00 to COTC/SEO.

- 1 lined work jacket
- 2 pair sneakers (these are required as part of the uniform on BRISTOL and at HMS Raleigh for Sea Cadet training)

- 1 pair dress black military shoes

Navy PT gear including: PT shorts, T-shirt, sweat shirt & sweat pants (all now available through NHQ)

Cadets MUST have all of the above items

This is not the complete sea bag list, but it is basically all of the uniform parts necessary.

Laundry facilities are limited there.

Absolutely no "baggy" civilian pants for males or females

Travel directions - Cadets are not to make plane reservations until approved by COTC, then cadets are to arrive Heathrow prior to noon. COTC/SEO will coordinate with each individual cadet and will be there to meet all planes and get them on the coach.

1999 UNITED STATES SEA CADET INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE

AT D.C. and NORFOLK, VA

1. **Dates.** 11-24 July joining/departing D.C.; 13-23 July joining/departing Norfolk.
2. **General.** This program is designed as a fun program involving cadets from at least five countries. It provides U.S. cadets with an excellent opportunity to interact with cadets from other countries and be "goodwill ambassadors" for the United States. The program is designed to instill teamwork and understanding. Commanding Officers should encourage outstanding cadets to apply for this once in a lifetime opportunity to help escort cadets from other countries around the D.C. and Norfolk, Va. area. The program is hosted by the U.S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps and sponsored by Commander in Chief, U. S. Atlantic (CINCLANT) and the Navy Recruiting Command. The group of cadets and escorts will start and end the exchange in D.C., with most time spent in Norfolk. U.S. cadets may join either in D.C. or Norfolk. The countries scheduled to participate include Bermuda, Great Britain, The Netherlands, Belgium and the United States. Each country is allocated five cadets and one escort officer.
3. **Training/Activities.** The program is scheduled to start in Norfolk, VA on Tuesday 13 July. Cadets visiting will have arrived in the U.S. on the preceding Sunday and will have visited Washington D.C. prior to their arrival in Norfolk on 13 July. In D.C. they will stay at Andrews AFB. U.S. cadets may join at either location. The program includes training in damage control, confidence/physical fitness course, and other nautical oriented training. While in Norfolk, the group will tour various places, including an Aircraft Carrier (hopefully), possibly a Submarine, Destroyer, and other type ships as available. Other activities include visits to local nautical museums, tour of historical ships, harbor cruise and amusement parks (Busch Gardens, etc.), and the visit to Washington D.C.
4. **Qualifications:**
 - 16 years of age or older
 - E-3 or above
 - Awarded the NSCC Cadet Citation Ribbon
 - Recommended by Unit Commanding Officer
5. **Logistics/Cost.** The cost of the training is \$150, which includes messing, berthing, transportation and all tour costs. Berthing will be at Andrews Air Force Base and Camp Pendleton Army National Guard Base, located 2 or 3 miles from the Fleet Combat Training Center in Dam Neck, Va. The amount of personal spending money is up to the parents; however, \$100 (minimum) is recommended. Early arrival on 13 July is requested for those cadets joining in Norfolk so that cadets can help in preparations for arrival of the main party from D.C.
6. **Application Procedures.** **CALL COTC FIRST AND OBTAIN HIS APPROVAL. THEN SUBMIT NSC-22 APPLICATION DIRECTLY TO NHQ, DO NOT SEND TO COTC. SUBMIT \$150 TO COTC/SENIOR ESCORT OFFICER UPON REPORTING.** Applications for the International exchange must be received at NHQ not later than 1 June. Notification of selection or non-selection will be made by 2 June.

1999 UNITED KINGDOM (2) SEA CADET EXCHANGE PROGRAM

(aboard HMS Bristol)

1. **Dates:** Arrive Thursday 15 July, depart Tuesday 27 July
2. **General:** The USNSCC is authorized to send five (4) cadets (male or female) and one escort. All other International Sea Cadet Association countries have been invited to participate. This camp will be aboard the HMS Bristol, the only type 82, guided missile destroyer built and now the Naval Cadet Forces Accommodation Ship berthed at Whale Island, Portsmouth, Hampshire, England. Dress uniform is not required, working uniform/dungarees is required for work details and boating. Bring civilian sports and recreational clothing with strong and comfortable walking shoes or boots; dress civilian clothes for travel, tours, visits. COTC to amplify as required for all attendees.
3. **Training/Activities:** Boatwork, seamanship, full bore shooting, practical leadership tests, canoeing, fire drills, diving aptitude tests, small arms shooting, offshore sailing, dinghy sailing, and sea passages in off shore power craft will be scheduled. There will also be a two day camping expedition in the New Forrest, many sporting activities and competitions, and a summer farewell disco. All cadets will be fully integrated with one another. The program will be full with little time for sight seeing or cultural visits apart from those included in the schedule.
4. **Qualifications:** Sea Cadets applying for this exchange must meet the following requirements:
 - Must be 16 or older on or before the start of training
 - Must be E-3 or above
 - Must not have participated in this exchange before
 - Recipient of the Cadet Citation Ribbon
 - Recommended by unit Commanding Officer
 - Be in good physical condition
5. **Logistics/Costs.** NSCC personnel will travel to and from Portsmouth England by commercial air at their own expense. Transportation between Portsmouth and the HMS Bristol will be provided. **Cadets must have a valid passport in their possession before leaving the United States.** Berthing is provided. The cost for the camp is approximately \$100.00. It is recommended that cadets take at least \$150.00 personal spending money to pay for personal gifts, souvenirs, and other personal items.
6. **Application procedures.** **SUBMIT TRAINING REQUESTS (NSC-22) DIRECTLY TO NHQ** as early as possible; applications due not later than 21 May, preferred by 17 April.

VERY IMPORTANT: NHQ must advise the UK if we are going to participate not later than 17 April. We must identify a COTC by then. NSCC officers interested in being the COTC/Senior Escort Officer are to advise Capt NYLAND (703) 243 6910, or e-mail: HNYLAND@navyleague.org before 15 April. This exchange has to have a COTC identified by then or we must decline. COTC selection will occur on 15 April.
- Applications will be entertained by NHQ up until 21 May 1999. Selections will be made immediately following. **Preference will be given to those fully qualified cadets forwarding their applications by 17 April.** This early date is requested by the UK and is necessary to allow for early notification so that selectees have plenty of time to make flight arrangements. Notification of selection will be made by NHQ, and those selected will be given additional information on other uniform/clothing items, an updated program of events, and other items of interest as provided by the U.K.
7. **COTC/Senior Escort Officer:** Will be identified by 15 April.
8. **Other.** COTC and NHQ must be notified of travel arrangements made (arrival/departure times, airline name, flight numbers, etc.) so that required information can be provided to responsible personnel in the U.K. Quotas: 4M/F cadets, 1M/F escort.

1999 NETHERLANDS SEA CADET EXCHANGE PROGRAM

1. **Dates:** 15 July arrival Amsterdam through 1 August.
2. **General.** The Netherlands has extended an invitation for four male/female cadets and one escort officer to participate in their exchange program during the period from 15 July to 1 August. Most of the Dutch cadets speak English.
3. **Training/Activities.** After arrival in Amsterdam on 15 July, the 16th is scheduled in and around Amsterdam to overcome any jet lag. On 17 July cadets will be transported to their National Summer Camp Training Site in an old and small town of MIDDELHARNIS. The training portion of the visit will take part in this Summer Camp through 24 July. Following this the group will return to Amsterdam for sightseeing and a touring. It is expected that most of the uniforms should be the dungaree working uniform with one dress uniform required. Civilian clothes should be taken for liberty periods.
4. **Qualifications:**
 - 16 years of age or older
 - E-3 or above
 - Awarded the NSCC Cadet Citation Ribbon
 - Not have previously participated
 - Be in good physical condition
5. **Logistics/Costs.** NSCC personnel will be responsible for their own air transportation to The Netherlands, and should plan to fly into Schiphol (Amsterdam Airport) on 15 July. Return should be on or around 1 August. **Cadets must have in their possession a valid U.S. Passport before leaving the United States.** The cost of the exchange is approximately \$150 (US). This fee covers messing, berthing and entrance fees for tourist attractions. Although the weather is generally very good in July, it can also be quite rainy. All personnel are encouraged to bring a raincoat. Cadets should bring at least \$100 for spending money for souvenirs and local transportation. The Netherlands is expensive.
6. **Application Procedures.** **CALL NHQ AND ADVISE OF INTEREST.** All applications must be received at NHQ not later than 1 May to allow for early notification of selectees and early arrangements for flights. Preference to early fully qualified applicants. **SUBMIT NSC-22's DIRECTLY TO NHQ.** Notification of selection or non-selection will be made as soon as quotas are filled but not later than 2 May. Applications will be entertained after the due date up until quotas are filled.
7. **COTC/Senior Escort Officer.** **NEED COTC.** If no COTC is identified by 1 May we will decline this opportunity.
8. Other. Quotas: 4 M/F cadet, 1 M/F escort.

1999 CANADA WEST SEA CADET EXCHANGE

(to Quadra)

1. **Dates.** Depart NAVSTA Everett 0600 18 July, return to NAVSTA Everett about 1600 1 August.
2. **General.** The training will take place at HMCS Quadra, Comox, British Columbia, 18 July-1 August. This base is a Canadian Sea Cadet Training base. Transportation to and from HMCS Quadra will be by bus and ferry, with pickup points at SeaTac Airport in Seattle, Washington. NSCC personnel will need to provide their own transportation to and from SeaTac Airport in Seattle, Washington.
3. **Training/Activities.** The training at HMCS Quadra will be with approximately 1000 Canadian Naval Sea Cadets. The training consists of sailing, pulling, cooking, sail making, firearms, and military drills. The program at HMCS Quadra covers considerable material in a very short period of time. Cadets applying for the program should be well versed in basic seamanship terminology and skills.
4. **Qualifications:**
 - Must be 16 years of age or older
 - E-3 or above
 - Must have been awarded the NSCC Cadet Citation Ribbon
 - Recommended by the Unit Commanding Officer
 - Not have previously participated
5. **Logistics/Costs.** Transportation (or transportation directions) will be provided from SeaTac Airport, in Seattle, Washington for those flying in for this exchange on Saturday 17 July. Berthing and messing will be provided at NAVSTA, Everett for the night of 17 July for those who need it. **Cadets should be prepared to pay for this one night's messing and berthing expense, about \$15.00.** Current plans are for cadets to depart NAVSTA Everett at 0600 hours on Sunday 18 July for their trip to Quadra. Similarly, upon completion of training and return to NAVSTA Everett in late afternoon (about 4 PM) of 1 August, messing and berthing will be available for those cadets who need to stay overnight before catching flights home on Monday 2 August. **Cadets should be prepared to pay for this night's messing and berthing as well, about \$15.00.** The cost for the program itself is \$50. In addition, each cadet should bring \$60 for miscellaneous expenses. If a cadet is selected, uniform information and additional details will be provided to those selected.

NSCC JAPAN SEA CADET EXCHANGE

1. **Dates.** 25 July-10 August
2. **General.** Japan's Friends of the Sea have extended an invitation to the United States for 5 cadets and two adult escorts to visit Japan during the period 25 July through 10 August. This is a first class exchange during which there will be a cruise from Nagoya to Sendai in Japan.
3. **Training/Activities.** Cadets will participate in cultural activities, spend time with Japanese host families and participate in an International Youth Forum. While the exchange will start in Nagoya, the city of Osaka will also be visited and cadets will get a cultural tour in Kyoto. Cultural activities and sports events are scheduled during a visit to Okinawa.
4. **Qualifications.**

1999 CANADA EAST SEA CADET EXCHANGE
