1. We fully expect that in 1999 there will be foreign exchange opportunities with the United Kingdom, Sweden, Netherlands, Belgium, Bermuda, Canada, Japan, and Korea. Details will be developed in Dec 98 and Jan 99. Formal promulgation of all opportunities is expected in February 99.

2. At enclosure (1) is the foreign exchange opportunity with Korea. This exchange is being advertised now because the exchange information has been provided well ahead of the rest and deadlines are earlier. Please note the following:

- NSCC NHQ is requested to respond to the Sea Explorers of Korea **NLT 15 January** with regard to our intentions to participate or not. Quotas are 1 Officer and 4 Cadets.
- NSCC NHQ must provide names and forward applications by 15 March 1999.
- Description and cost information is at encl (1).
- Prerequisites are:
  - 15 years or older
  - E-3 or above
  - Awarded the NSCC Cadet Citation Ribbon
  - Recommended by Unit Commanding Officer
  - Be in good physical condition

3. Unit CO's are requested to advertise this opportunity among all cadets, and to **call NHQ, Capt (Ret) Henry Nyland, (703) 243-6910 and advise of interested cadets so as to make the 15 January deadline.** Please note that an adult escort will be required for this training. If no interest is shown by 15 January by any one, we will decline the opportunity. Application guidance will be subsequently provided to those cadets who express interest and want to participate; application forms will include a locally completed NSC-22, and a completed ISCA registration and indemnity and waiver form

(2 forms) which NHQ will provide. Applications themselves will be due not later than 15 March. A passport sized photo is required to be affixed to one of the ISCA application forms and a passport will be required by the date of travel. In the event more than 4 cadets desire to apply, we will attempt to increase our quota allocation. Failing that a selection process will be employed to select the best qualified to represent our nation to the Korean Sea Explorers.

4. NSCC insurance coverage information is as per refs (a) and (b). Cadets participating in organized Sea Cadet activities under orders, including exchange programs, are provided medical payment coverage, without regard to liability, for all reasonable medical expenses incurred by persons as a result of bodily injury. Coverage also includes bodily injury, property damage and personal injury caused to a third party arising out of the insured cadet's negligence. Specifics are as per the referenced Memo and Information Sheet.

1999 summer exchange programme

## Brief Schedule

1. Name of the event : The 8th International Youth Sea Festival
2. Period : From July 26, 1999 through August 04, 1999 (10 days)
3. Venue : Seoul and Kangwon-do, the eastern coastal region  
of Korean Peninsula
4. No. of participants : About 100 including SEK members
5. Major Programme (for 10 days)

- 1) Opening & Closing ceremony
- 2) Joint sea training and sailing on board (2 days)  
(Rafting, Rubber boating, Canoeing, Snorkeling etc.)
- 3) Competition Game at beach (1 day)  
(Fin-kick race, canoe race etc.)
- 3) Visiting and studying cultural sites  
and industrial facilities (1 day)
- 4) Culture exchange  
(Performance of the participating countries)
- 5) Learning about Korea (1 day)  
(Korean folk dance or Korean traditional music)
- 6) Homestay (3 days)
- 7) Others (2 days)  
(Arrival & departing day)

### 6. Others

The detailed itinerary will be distribute to the member countries in late January, 1999.

1. Period : July 26, 1999 - August 04, 1999 (9 nights and 10 days)

2. Venue : Seoul and Kangwon-do

3. Quota : Within one(1) officer & four(4) cadets

The escort officer is required to be fluent in English

4. Age : Cadets should be between 15 years old and 18 years old.

5. Proposed entering and departing point

- Gimpo International Airport

6. Sponsorship

This exchange programme will be organized by Sea Explorers of Korea, supported by the Ministry of Culture and Tourism, and the Ministry of Maritime Affairs and Fisheries.

7. Documents to be submitted

- Application form with one(1) passport size photo attached

- Description of impressions and opinions

※ This is to be made and submitted after the participants join and experience the exchange programme. At least, one(1) officer and one(1) cadet per organization are required to submit this description on the day before their departure from Korea. Its length are recommended to be within 800-1,000 words.

8. Application Deadline

We request that you inform us of your intention to attend the exchange programme with the anticipated number of the participants not later than January 15, 1999. The required documents for application should be sent to our head quarters by March 15, 1999.

## 9. Cost

The participants or their organization is responsible for the following expenses.

- 1) An airfare and its incidental expenses such as airport tax to/from the entering and departing place (Kimpo International Airport)
- 2) Personal spending money
- 3) Overseas travel insurance premium covering medical, accident, liability etc. The participants all are requested to be insured for the programme.

Sea Explorers of Korca will take responsibility for the following expenses from/to the entering and departing place(Kimpo International Airport).

- 1) Accommodation, Normal meals, Land tour costs etc.
- 2) Expenses taken to run off the officially scheduled programme
