I am pleased to inform you that efforts to obtain \$2 million in federal funding for the Naval Sea Cadet Corps were partially successful, and legislation signed by the President will provide \$1M during fiscal year 2001.

My sincere thanks to those who took the time to encourage their Congressional representatives to support this legislation.

And special thanks to Captain Steve Barrett, USNR (Ret), of your national staff, for his direct efforts with the various Congressional Representatives, Senators, their staffs and military personnel. In less than a year, Captain Barrett was able to successfully bring this important support effort to fruition.

The funds will probably not be received by the Sea Cadet program until sometime in Spring 2001. However, your national staff is now working on plans to use these funds to help relieve some financial burdens of our Cadets and their families related to expenses incurred in our various training programs.

This should be good news for current members; and should result in substantial growth of our important youth program. Details are provided in Action letter 13-00 dated 30 August 2000, and below.

Federal Funding Update

CAPT S. BARRETT, USNR (Ret), *NHQ Liason for Federal Funding*

As you already know from the Chairman's message, efforts to obtain federal funding in support of NSCC were successful. The FY2001 Defense Appropriations, Bill, Public Law 106-259, was signed by the President on August 9, 2000. The funding was included in the budget of the Naval Recruiting Command, our Navy Program manager.

Under the law, SECNAV is directed to provide a plan, by December 31st, listing the benefits of our program to the Navy, and identify the financial, material and manpower resources the Navy should make available to NSCC in order to expand the program.

My sincere thanks to all who took the time to write their Congressional mem-bers requesting support for the program.

The benefit of your letters cannot be overstated. My job would have been impossible had not letters from Sea Cadet Officers, Cadets, their families, Navy Leaguers and other friends been written. These letters helped open doors on the Hill.

Now I ask you to consider writing "Thank You" letters to the Congress-ional members for their support, and invite them to see "their" cadets.

Your letters will again be important as we work for inclusion in the FY2002 Budget. **I ask that you time your letters to arrive at Congressional offices no later than early January 2001.**

The totals are 2917 male and 724 female cadets who reported with NHQ orders. Supporting these 3641 cadets were another 297 male and 159 female officers; 456 total officers, reporting with NHQ orders in hand to escort these fine young cadets in their summer training. The grand total of orders

issued by NHQ stands at 4097 for summer 2000. This compares with approximately 4047 for summer 1998 and around 4200 for 1999.

We suspect that escalating training costs may be the culprit inhibiting higher numbers, but when compared with onboard counts, we still had a wonderful summer with lots of opportunities with the vast majority of cadets participating.

Once again NHQ staff renders a most respectful salute to all the cadets who participated and to those adult volunteers who gave the most precious gift of all, their time, in support of the cadets.

A “Well Done” to all, for an another outstanding summer.

NSC-24C (LOCAL ORDERS)

We must also recognize and salute the many, many locally arranged training evolutions for which NHQ orders were not required.

Please remember the requirement for 24C submissions for those evolutions exceeding 5 days. Upon receipt, we will add more training completions for those cadets who joined the U.S. Coast Guard cutters and stations for seamanship training during the summer.

Beyond that our thanks also extend to cover all other training opportunities in excess of 5 days aboard our Navy ships, bases and stations; all locally arranged.

OTHER TRAINING

And we also know there were and continue to be other outstanding training participation less than 5 days duration with adult escort contributions, of which we are not aware.

We offer our, “Well Done”, to all of you for all of these evolutions as well and only ask that you continue your outstanding work.

SHIPBOARD TRAINING

Again this summer, efforts to formally schedule shipboard TWT opportunity met with limited success. As in the last two summers, the Navy continued to welcome and look for opportunities to host Sea Cadets, but these opportunities presented themselves with little advance notice, or were locally arranged.

Those that did occur were of exceptional training quality. The secret continues to be locally arranged evolutions, based on direct dialogue between ships and local units. Once again our salutes go to those of you who are doing this, along with our encouragement to keep up the fine effort.

WINTER TRAINING

Cost and application procedure information will be promulgated when known. Look for it around mid to late October.

Christmas this year falls on a Monday. Because the number of training days available between the day after Christmas and

the day after New Years, a Tuesday, recruit training will not be offered unless the school break extends to 8 January affording a full 13 days for training. Personnel desiring to sponsor a recruit training or advanced training over this holiday are asked to call NHQ, Capt Nyland, at the soonest opportunity.

EXCERPTS FROM NSCC INFO LTR 13-00

The total dollar amount of federal funding only allows funding support for cadet and escort berthing, messing and selective administrative costs, except for the foreign exchange programs where we expect to also provide training grants to help defray overseas travel costs.

Funded training will be training as contained in the 2001 Foreign Exchange Programs Information Letter and the 2001 Summer Training Schedule Information. Both these information letters are expected to be published no later than end February 2001.

For the Foreign Exchange Programs, berthing and messing costs as charged by host countries will be paid by the NSCC. Logistic costs for training as arranged by Senior Escort Officers and approved by NHQ will also be covered. Cadets approved for participation in the Foreign Exchange program may also expect to receive training grants to help defray overseas travel costs. Coordination will continue through Senior Escort Offices and NHQ. Details for each exchange to include costs and/ or reasonable expenses, what’s paid for and what’s not, will be promulgated in the Information Letter. Because competition for quotas will be keen, all hands may expect cadet eligibility prerequisites to be adjusted to target those cadets with sustained superior performance.

Funded training will include berthing and messing for Coast Guard Training as contained in the Summer Training Schedule as well as training at USCG activities not advertised but locally arranged and carries out for 5 days or more under NSC-24C orders. Specific direction will be provided in the Summer Training Schedule Information Letter and will probably follow the reimbursement process for all other NSC 24C training as outlined immediately below in the next paragraph. Requirements for prior approval will be in the Information Letter.

For all other locally arranged training carried out under NSC 24 orders of 5 days or more in length, not in the summer training schedule, we expect to be able to fund messing and berthing expenses as well. However, prior approval from NHQ

will be required. NHQ will provide necessary request for approval forms for use by Unit COs who desire this training. We plan to post forms on the internet and include them in the next addition to the Advancement and Training Manual, and the next up-date of the Admin Manual. Generally, what we will be looking for is that the proposed training meet NSCC goals and objectives and that berthing and messing costs are reasonable, and roughly com-parable to costs as if onboard a Naval Base or other military installation. We anticipate berthing and messing costs incurred as a result of all training on NSC-24C orders will be subject to reimbursement, with reimbursements accomplished via the unit CO at the end of the summer. Once again, local training subject to reimbursement will have to be approved in advance by NHQ so that funding can be reserved. At summer's end, unit COs will batch submit their NSC 24Cs for all their cadets, for all NSC 24C training over the summer. We will ask for a grand total cost for all approved NSC 24C summer training. NHQ will reimburse that cost to the unit, unit to directly reimburse cadets.

For summer 2001 training as contained in the Foreign Exchange and Summer Training Schedule Information letters, we anticipate the process to be:

Cadets and escorts will submit requests for orders to NHQ via the COTC just as has been the practice for the last two years.

Requests will be due to the COTC one month prior to the training start date.

One month prior to training, COTCs will complete and forward to NHQ their funding support request based on the number of cadet and escort orders received, cost of berthing and messing, and historical/best guess administrative costs. NHQ will provide COTCs with all necessary forms.

COTCs will forward to NHQ their request for funding support.

Upon receipt, NHQ will issue COTCs funding to support training. COTCs to have funding in hand approximately 2-3 weeks prior to training, as provided by NHQ.

Upon completion of training, COTCs will submit training audit reports as currently required. Excess funds will be returned, shortages will be reimbursed.

Generally, training deposits will not be required unless directed in the advertising information letters. Training deposits were implemented to reduce no-shows, and provide COTCs seed money. Federal funding now eliminates seed cost requirements. Responsibility to control no-shows will rest with the Unit COs. No-show represent a wasted quota, and each wasted quota represents one cadet who didn't get a training opportunity. Unit COs who abuse this responsibility will be subject to poorer annual inspection grades by Regional Directors. (Remember, COTCs send NSCTNG-012s to Regional Directors after training and no-show information can be included.)

Travel costs to and from the training site will not be funded. This is the current policy and practice and will be

unchanged with the exception of training grants to defray overseas travel costs for the foreign exchange program. It will remain the parent and unit responsibility to get their cadets to the training site.

Note: If there are any funds remaining after cadet summer training is paid for, we plan to partially reimburse cadet enrollment fees and to fund fall 2001 officer OPD berthing, messing and course administration fees. This is entire dependent upon availability of funds at summer's end after all cadet training is paid for, and can not be guaranteed. No-shows may ineligible for this reimbursement.

All hands must understand that while our goal to reduce cost for summer training in 2001 stand firm, and cadet costs in 2001 will be greatly reduced, specifics presented herewith with regard to process and other longer range goals as subject to change. The primary intent of this letter is to present and announced training costs for 2001, and give all NSCC personnel a rough idea of how funds will be applied, so that you may inform your cadets, plan accordingly, and incorporate this information into discussions with new and prospective cadets and their parents.

The Naval Sea Cadet Corps is healthier than ever before, and holds great promise for the future, and clearly stands on its own merit as a premier national youth program. It has now been recognized by Congress for its outstanding contribution to the youth of our nation and is a program that all members can be proud of. Because of its merit, newly recognized status, and congressional support, the challenge now is to further expand among even more of our nation's youth the opportunity to join and enjoy the benefits of our NSCC program. Hopefully these reduced costs will allow the prospective cadet who previously didn't join the program due to expense, to now join and experience "The Adventure of a Lifetime."

We here at NSCC headquarters will work hard to further expand summer training opportunities for even more cadets. In the interim, we ask you to inform our cadets of our progress, and explain to them the reduced training expenses they may anticipate, for sure in 2001, and hopefully for many years to come. Please hold an all hands meeting, and invite all parents to come. We also ask you to hold the doors open for all additional cadets who may desire to join, and encourage their participation in accordance with the goals of the NSCC. Additional adults will be needed, and we solicit your support as well in expanding adult ranks. **Growth is anticipated, desired, and necessary in that it will be the basis for continued and additional congressional funding in the out years.**

VFW VOICE OF DEMOCRACY

The Veterans of Foreign Wars and its Ladies Auxiliary annually sponsor a Voice of Democracy patriotic essay competition. Deadline for submitting essays is 1 November 2000. More than \$2.5 million scholarship awards are made. First prize is a \$25,000 scholarship to the college or university of the winner's choice, and a trip to Washington, DC.

The theme is "What Price Freedom."

Contestants must be in the 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grades, properly enrolled in public, private or parochial high schools or in a home study program. Foreign Exchange students, and adults over the age of 19, are not eligible to participate in this competition.

Contestants must submit a 3-5 minute written essay and a recording of the essay on an audio cassette tape. The items should be given to the high school or local VFW Post Voice of Democracy chairman, **no later than Nov 1, 2000.**
